Dear Parents,

We have had a fantastic beginning in our new school! I have so appreciated the hard work of our staff as they prepared even prior to preplanning to create an inviting atmosphere for our students. The building is HUGE. I am sure that it was somewhat intimidating upon your first visit. It certainly was intimidating for all of us after being in our old building for so long. I think that the staff is beginning to know their way around the building. Some staff have remarked that they could benefit from owning a GPS! We have worked hard to create procedures so that things run smoothly throughout the school day. If you have visited the school, I hope you have noticed how well the students have acclimated to their new surroundings.

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From the Co-Presidents...

If you're like the rest of us, you spent the summer driving past a massive construction site wondering 'how are they ever going to finish that school by August?' After months of hard work, a few sleepless nights, and several creative solutions to recess, the NEW East Side Elementary opened - ON TIME!! Our building may be new, but we still have the same amazing teachers and administrators! We are celebrating 60 years of impeccable performance at East Side so we chose "Building on Success" as our theme for the year.

The East Side PTA provides many different resources to the school and students and it might be helpful to explain some of them. We'd like to particularly thank the father who raised his hand at the August PTA meeting to ask "What is this Appropriations line-item in the budget?" Appropriations is the way PTA allocates money for teachers. Teachers may request funds for many reasons - like education grants or additional classroom supplies for special projects - that may not be in the county or school budget. Our Appropriations budget is the vehicle used to fund such projects. Last year, the East Side PTA allocated \$32,000 to Appropriations. This money funded such items as teacher training from the elite Columbia Reading Institute and over \$9,000 for classroom books to support this training. Other projects funded through the Appropriations budget include: a differentiated math conference, a Mountain Math and Language program, as well as training for our Target and Special Education teachers.

These additional programs and training initiatives were only possible due to the impact of our Boosterthon Fundraiser. This program was incredibly successful and we are excited to bring back the Fun Run again this year! Last year the success of the Boosterthon allowed us to increase our Appropriations budget by 75%. Every penny

that we raise this year over our targeted fund raising goal will go directly into Appropriations. Many of the programs that make East Side a great school are a result of your generosity and the hard work and persistence of our students. Boosterthon is a dynamic fundraiser that teaches valuable lessons to our kids while helping the PTA to further enhance their classroom environment.

We thank you in advance for the time and energy you will put into improving the lives of our students this year. The tireless dedication of parent volunteers drives our school community forward and makes the impossible possible. Without you, our children would have fewer opportunities to learn, grow, and develop. Thanks to all of you and we look forward to seeing you this year.

For 60 years, East Side Elementary has been a landmark in East Cobb. We'd like to invite you to join us as we kick off the next 60 years of this wonderful school.

Family fun events such as the upcoming Fall Festival and Sock Hop are also funded by the PTA.

Last year, thanks to money raised through the Fun Run, the PTA paid for East Side teachers to attend the Columbia Reading Institute along with all the books to support the training. The PTA also helped pay for several Math, Social Studies and Science programs.

AuPairCare

An au pair is a young adult from another country who lives with a host family and provides in-home childcare for up to 45 hours per week. Au pairs also assist with light housekeeping and other duties associated with childcare such as: doing children's laundry, driving children to school and extracurricular activities, preparing children's meals, and supervising homework. The weekly cost averages about \$340 or \$7.50 an hour.

AuPairCare is offering PTA families a waived application fee and an additional \$300 savings in program fees, which is a total savings of \$650. For more information please contact your local Area Director at 678-398-7225.

Fit in Fifth, Third and First

Georgia has the second highest childhood obesity rate in the United States. East Side PTA wants to help change that disturbing statistic. Several years ago, a group of parents in the PTA put together a wonderful program to help teach our elementary children health awareness, fitness skills and nutritional tips. This program of 6 lessons on health, nutrition and fitness was made for fifth graders and called Fit in 5th. It was well-received by students, parents and teachers alike.

Following the success of Fit in Fifth, the Health and Wellness Committee saw immediate value in adding health and fitness programs for younger students. A group of parent volunteers including nutrition experts, yoga teachers and personal trainers began to develop Fit in Third. This program was first taught in 2009 and includes lessons on strength, cardio, flexibility, whole food vs. processed food, and body image. It gives third graders the chance to stretch, run, take their pulse and count out the teaspoons of sugar from a soft drink. Mostly they see that staying healthy isn't about being fantastic at sports or being skinny, but about making good choices, staying active and keeping a healthy attitude.

Last year, Fit in First was added to the Fit Programs. It includes innovative lessons on how to fit 5 fruits and vegetables into your day, what makes your heart stronger, and why stretching is good for you. With several games to do as part of the lessons, Fit in First gets students thinking about how to stay healthy while they are having fun.

Our Health and Wellness committee meets a few times each year to help East Side PTA plan for Fit Programs, Farm-to-School projects, Fresh Fruit Fridays, improvements to school lunches and other projects. 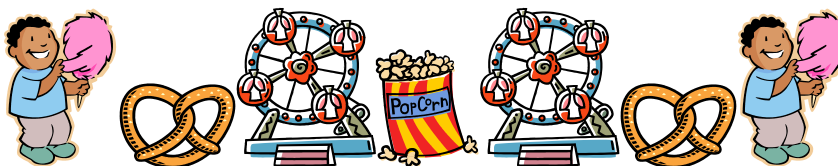
Fall Festival - Carnival Under the Stars!

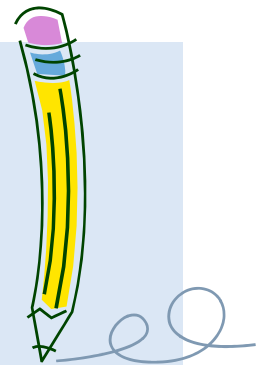

Red Ribbon Week 2011 is Coming!

October 17th - 21st

Red Ribbon Week is the oldest and largest drug prevention campaign in the country. Each year, East Side participates by getting every student and teacher involved in a way that brings the message to our school community. The week commemorates the ultimate sacrifice made by DEA Special Agent Enrique "Kiki" Camarena, who died at the hands of drug traffickers, and serves to remind our children about the dangers of illegal drugs.

Enrique "Kiki" Camarena grew up in a dirt-floored house, and like many kids had the hopes and dreams of making a difference. After serving in the US Marines and then joining law enforcement, he decided to make his difference in the highly dangerous DEA (Drug Enforcement Agency), even though his mother tried to talk him out of it. "I can't not do this," he told her. "I'm only one person, but I want to make a difference." In 1985 Kiki was assassinated while working undercover, trying to protect our children.

This year East Side students will be asked to participate in a different way each day, to reinforce the drug prevention message to our children. Parents are encouraged to participate as well.
